## WASA prepared for the 2025 Dry Season

## Encourages Water Conservation as key tool to ensure a reliable and sustainable water supply

The Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) wishes to inform the national community that the Trinidad and Tobago Meteorological Service (TTMS) has officially declared the start of the 2025 Dry Season today, Tuesday 14th January 2025. As we transition into this drier period, it is crucial for all citizens to adopt sustainable water management practices to ensure a consistent and reliable supply of pipe-borne water throughout the Dry Season.

The declaration of the Dry Season follows a gradual shift from the wetter months, with recent climatic patterns indicating a significant reduction in rainfall across Trinidad and Tobago. Although rainfall activity over the last few weeks has positively recharged our impounded reservoirs closer to our Long-Term Averages, we will heighten water supply management activity in accordance with our Dry Season Water Management Plan.

Key elements of this plan include:

- Public Awareness: Under the banner, "Conserve today...Secure tomorrow," we will use all media platforms to keep stakeholders informed about supply challenges and mitigation measures, conservation techniques, reservoir updates.
- Monitoring and Management of Water Resources: Ensure a strategic and equitable distribution of resources.
- Infrastructure Maintenance and Upgrades: Robust execution of our maintenance protocol to minimize leaks as well as the continued replacement of aged infrastructure to ensure reliability and efficiency.
