UPDATE ON WATER TREATMENT FACILITIES IMPACTED BY OVERNIGHT RAINFALL – All resources focused on returning facilities to full service.

The Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) advises the public that several surface water treatment facilities in the Northeast Region are currently out of operation due to heavy overnight rainfall. Adverse weather conditions have caused riverine flooding, high turbidity, clogged intake screens, and siltation, disrupting normal operations at the following facilities:

Quare	Orchid Ext., Valencia Old Road, Quare Rd/Cumaca Rd, Plantation Rd/San Pablo, San Pedro/Flamboyant Crescent and environs	
North Oropouche	Reduced production – Maloney, Carapo, Malabar, Five Rivers, Tumpuna, Sangre Grande, Manzanilla and environs	

WASA is actively working to restore operations and will provide further updates as the situation progresses. Every effort is being made to return these facilities to service at the earliest possible time.
