

PLANNED SERVICE DISRUPTION TO CUSTOMERS SERVED BY THE NORTH OROPOUCHE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

Friday 13th March 2026: The Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) wishes to advise customers served by the North Oropouche Water Treatment Plant (WTP) that there will be a disruption in their pipe-borne water supply to facilitate an emergency cleaning operation at the plant's intake.

This essential maintenance activity is scheduled to take place on Sunday 15th March, 2026, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. During this period, the treatment plant will be shut down to allow crews to perform the necessary cleaning, which is critical to ensuring the continued efficiency and raw water quality of the system.

Following the completion of works at 4:00 p.m., the North Oropouche WTP will be gradually restored to full operation. Customers are advised that it may take up to forty-eight (48) hours for the service to normalize to some affected areas, in accordance with established water supply schedules, following the completion of these works.
