

## **RESULTS: MAJOR PROGRESS IN RESTORATION OF VANDALISED TOBAGO WELLS**

**Sunday 29th March, 2026:** Three key water supply facilities are now back in operation following recent acts of vandalism in Tobago.

The Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) advises that Arnos Vale Well #4, Bacolet Well #3 and Claude Noel Highway Well have been fully repaired, with all works completed.

Our operations team has been working tirelessly since morning to complete repairs and restore service in the shortest possible time. Works at Bloody Bay Well #1 are nearing completion. Additionally, the Authority is awaiting water quality test results for the Bloody Bay Tank before the system can be safely returned to full service.

In the interim, truck-borne water service remains available to affected customers, who are encouraged to contact WASA's Service Centre at 639-9272, 639-6850, or 639-6853 to request assistance.

WASA continues to monitor the situation closely and remains committed to restoring a reliable and consistent water supply to all affected communities as quickly as possible.
