

WASA ADDRESSES MAJOR TRANSMISSION MAIN LEAK ALONG BEETHAM GARDENS

April 6th, 2026: The Water and Sewerage Authority (the Authority) was alerted earlier today to a substantial leak on the Air Valve welding of the 36” transmission main located along Beetham Gardens, Port of Spain.

In the interest of public safety and infrastructure integrity, WASA teams immediately initiated emergency response protocols. Crews are currently accessing and operating valves to dewater the affected 36” Booster Line in order to safely carry out repairs.

This leak directly impacts operations at the El Socorro Booster Station, resulting in service disruptions in the following areas:

- Knaggs Hill & Picton II Reservoir
- Black River, Barataria, Laventille
- Port of Spain, Mordant, East Dry River
- St. Barbs, Gonzales, Long Circular
- Dundonald Hill, Dibe, Woodblock
- St. James, Cocorite, Belmont
- Cascade, St. Anns

Additionally, the El Socorro High Lift Station is out of operation, affecting:

- Boundary Road & Boundary Road Extension
- Aranguez Main Road, El Socorro Road
- Don Miguel Road, Black River

WASA confirms the following estimated timeline for restoration:

- **By 6:00am on Tuesday, 7th April 2026** – The Booster Station will resume operations at 50% production, and the High Lift Station will be returned to service.
- **By 8:00pm on Tuesday, 7th April 2026** – The Booster Station will return to 100% production.

WASA fully understands the inconvenience this interruption causes and assures the public that repair teams are working diligently to resolve the situation as quickly as possible. However, the safety of workers and the public remains the Authority's highest priority, and repairs will not be rushed at the expense of safety.

WASA thanks affected residents and businesses for their patience as teams work expeditiously to restore normal service in the shortest possible time.
