

ESSENTIAL T&TEC WORKS AT CARONI WATER TREATMENT PLANT TO CAUSE TEMPORARY DISRUPTION IN SUPPLY

Friday 29th May, 2026: The Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) advises customers in several parts of North, Central, and South Trinidad that there will be a temporary disruption to their pipe-borne water supply due to essential works being carried out by the Trinidad and Tobago Electricity Commission (T&TEC).

T&TEC will execute a critical 20/25MVA transformer installation at the Caroni Arena Substation, located at the Caroni Water Treatment Plant. Consequently, the 66kV bus will be de-energised, requiring a complete shutdown of the Caroni Water Treatment Facility.

- Start: Wednesday, 3rd June, 2026 at 10:00 p.m.
- End: Thursday, 4th June, 2026 at 5:00 a.m.

During this period, customers may experience low water pressures or no supply at all in the affected areas.
